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TRM OVERVIEW





What is the 'Technical Reference Manual'?

The purpose of the Illinois Statewide Technical Reference Manual (TRM or IL-TRM) is to provide a transparent and consistent basis for calculating energy (electric kilowatt-hours (kWh) and natural gas therms) and capacity (electric kilowatts (kW)) savings generated by the State of Illinois' energy efficiency programs, which are administered by the state's largest electric and gas Utilities.

- The TRM is filed each year with the Illinois Commerce Commission as a consensus document.
- It is made up of 4 volumes: Overview, Commercial, Residential, Cross-cutting and Attachments.



What is the 'Technical Reference Manual'?

- Provides a common consistent reference document for all prescriptive efficiency programs in the State.
- Provides transparency in the basis for assumptions and calculations.
- Allows utilities to quantify savings towards regulatory goals and compliance.
- Identifies new opportunities for programs to pursue.
- Identifies gaps in robust assumptions that can be addressed by evaluation efforts in the State.
- Is an ever-evolving document to incorporate changing markets, evaluation results, new technologies



The TRM Process

Why it exists

- efficiency optimization (performance standards/goals)
- accountability for how funds are spent

Update Cycle

- Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) is convened each year to discuss issues, prioritize updates, and update TRM based on new information
- Filed each year with the Illinois Commerce
 Commission (ICC) as a consensus document

It is made up of 4 volumes

- 1. Overview and User Guide (Policy and Summary of Changes)
- 2. Commercial
- 3. Residential
- 4. Cross-cutting and Attachments

It also include an errata which identifies any changes or errors from previous program year




Why an Income Qualified Working Group?

Need for improved engagement with **Income Qualified program implementers and advocates** to ensure that impacts of TAC decisions/TRM changes on IQ programs are understood, are appropriate and that IQ communities' needs are being met.

Need for improved 2-way communication

IQ implementers and advocates have early view into what TAC is proposing



IQ-TRM WG to provide input to the TAC to explore where TRM should specify IQ customers differently and explore new measures with IQ focus




IQ TRM Working Group Objectives

- Create an early warning system to communicate to CBOs/CAAs upcoming measure changes.
- Explore IQ-focused changes and issues in the TRM.
 Propose issues to TAC for prioritization/consideration.
- Support development of measure changes or updates.
- **Solicit feedback** through existing channels from other stakeholders.

What we achieved snapshot 2021 + 2022

- Provided overview of TRM policies and process
- Convened Sixteen Working Group meetings
- Reached 35+ organizations for feedback
- Identified key issues in TRM based on working group feedback
- Identified data and evaluation needs (needed to move a measure forward)
- Identified individuals to "own" workpapers to advance proposed measures
- Established workplan and process as a group for the following year
- Collected feedback via survey and discussions
- Participated in LIAAC Related Issues meetings, SAG meetings



What we achieved snapshot 2021 + 2022

Proposed 5 measure updates to the TAC (all included in v.11)

- **ISR updates for IQ Kits** Advanced Power Strips, Pipe Insulation, Low Flow Aerators and Showerheads
- Mobile home specific furnace costs
- Furnace Blower Retrofit Cost based on IQ program data
- Air Handler Filter Cleaning/Replacement new measure requested by IQ committee
- Tree Planting discussed during v10; developed during v11
